

Resurrection - A Sign of Hope!

We celebrate today the high point of our Catholic Faith – the Resurrection of Jesus Christ. We have journeyed with him this Holy Week through his suffering and death on the Cross, into the tomb and today we rise with him to new life. The resurrection provides us with great hope. So often the circumstances of our lives threaten to overwhelm this frail human nature of ours – but Christ's victory over death always allows us to believe that things can and will get better. We need to be people of the resurrection, people who celebrate life.

Another reason for great hope on this Resurrection Day is that next Easter we hope to be back in our Church. If we can raise the necessary funds for the seismic work to continue then there is every reason to believe that in Easter 2017 we can celebrate our own Easter ceremonies at St Mary of the Angels.



Holy Saturday, the day of God's silence, invites us not only to solidarity with all who are abandoned and alone, but also to trust in that faithful love which turns death into life.

These, then, are days which speak to us powerfully of God's love and mercy. In one of her visions, Julian of Norwich hears the Lord say that he rejoices eternally because he was able to suffer for our sake out of love.
