Progress Report on Seismic Strengthening of the Church

We have reached a critical time in the project. We need a further \$1.3 million to complete the work. If we can achieve that we should be able to celebrate our Easter liturgies in the Church in April 2017.

Vespers for the Feast of All Saints

7.30pm Tuesday 1st November, St Joseph's Church Mt Victoria

This year our Parish will celebrate the Feast of All Saints with a Vespers liturgy at St Joseph's Church, Mt Victoria. This Vespers service, which lasts 45 minutes, is lead with music sung by our choir, including the Gregorian antiphons, psalms and canticle for the day, with the Magnificat, in a setting by Palestrina. Following the service the choir will sing a selection from their traditional and contemporary repertoire, including beautiful compositions by Sir John Tavener and Arvo Pärt.

Vespers has been celebrated in the tradition of the Church for over a thousand years, and on this occasion gives thanks and praise to the Saints - our inspirational role models. Come and be inspired by the glorious music set for this occasion by the musical visionaries Victoria, Palestrina, Peter Philips, and by the timeless sound of the chant.

We are very grateful to St Joseph's Parish for allowing us to use their Church so that we can continue the tradition of St Mary of the Angels while we are away from our own Church. We hope to see many of our parishioners gathered at St Joesph's Church on Tuesday evening.



The Glorious Mysteries of the Rosary

The Glorious Mysteries bring us to the triumphant conclusion on the Rosary. They portray our ultimate victory over death. To aid our understanding we find our sources in the gospel writers, including Luke, who was also author of Acts. There is a beautiful passage from St Paul to describe the bodily assumption of holy people into heaven, and a vision of St John to tell us of the glory of all the saints, and Our Lady.

The First Glorious Mystery - The Resurrection | Pray that you will experience the fulfilment of faith. For those who found that the tomb where they had laid Jesus was now empty, the experience must have been truly bewildering. Mary Magdalen and, later, some others were caught up in the strange events, which included angelic messages and the first appearance of Jesus after his death. For the Christian the day of resurrection is complete fulfilment. Mk 16:1-7

The Second Glorious Mystery - The Ascension | Pray that you will always experience hope in God's generosity. Eleven disciples witnessed the moment when Jesus ascended to heaven. It could have been a time of emptiness for this "little flock", as Jesus had earlier called them. But the message he gave them, the instructions he so firmly set out, and his affirmation of his presence until the end of time, proved that his Ascension was only the beginning.

The Third Glorious Mystery - The Descent of the Holy Spirit | Pray that they power of the Holy Spirit will inspire you too. Mary was with the disciples who had gathered to celebrate the Feast of Pentecost (an annual Jewish harvest festival). They were together in a room, when the Holy Spirit came to them - with the noise of a wind - and in the form of a flame which rested on each disciple. They were "filled with the Holy Spirit". There and then they began the work Jesus had instructed at his Ascension, a task of evangelization the Church fulfils to this day. Acts 2:1-13

The Fourth Glorious Mystery - The Assumption | Pray for constant friendship with the Mother of Jesus. The fact that Our Lady was "assumed" into heaven, body and soul, sharing in the bodily resurrection of Jesus, has been a defined doctrine of faith for Catholics since only 1950. But for centuries it was a firm tenet of belief not only for Catholics but for many other Christians, as well. 1 Cor 15:51-57

The Fifth Glorious Mystery - The Coronation | Pray for everlasting peace with Christ, his mother and all the saints. Catholics have always honoured Mary as Queen of Heaven and accept that after her Assumption she was crowned by her son as a mark of respect for her intimate role in his life. The belief is also an acknowledgement of the glory that awaits all holy people who will live in the presence of Our Lord and his Mother. This decade of the Rosary is a truly glorious conclusion to the prayer which takes us from Mary's acceptance of her role as the mother of our saviour to her ultimate place in heaven. There she accepts our prayers and intercedes on our behalf. Rev 7:9-12
