





The Visitation

Following the Seddon earthquakes in July 2013 and the closure of our Church I read a book called *The Visitation*. It is not about Mary's journey to visit her cousin Elizabeth but a book about the history of seismic activity in New Zealand and includes the Wellington earthquakes of 1842 and 1848 (which basically destroyed most of the brick buildings in the settlement) and the major Wairarapa quake of 1855 which severely impacted Wellington.

The Visitation happened again in the early hours of last Monday morning. All of us knew that this quake was not one of the smaller jolts that we experience from time to time but an event which continued for much longer and with great ferocity. It has had enormous implications with workplaces closed, people forced from their apartment buildings and much damage inside people's homes.

There is also the fear of further seismic activity and the prediction by the experts of aftershocks which may be as strong as the magnitude 7.8 we experienced last Sunday evening.

It is a timely reminder for us to remember our early settlers also went through a time of seismic activity. After the 1855 earthquake Bishop Viard placed Wellington under the protection of Mary. Each year we pray this prayer asking for the protection of Mary over our city. We will pray this prayer again at all Masses today.

Thank you to so many who have contacted us to ask about how the Church fared in the earthquake. I am pleased to report that there is absolutely no damage. The structural work is almost completed except for the towers and there is no doubt that the work carried out by our building contactors, LT McGuinness Ltd., over the past two years has ensured that our Church stood up well. We thank God for their tremendous efforts and skill in strengthening our Church.
