

# The Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ & Re-

commissioning of Ministries

"Not too many of those Kevin otherwise you will not eat your dinner." There was usually fresh baking available on our arrival home from school. Should we fall into the temptation of returning to the biscuit tin too often in one sitting there was usually a warning from Mum making it clear that the healthier food would be served at the evening meal.

The Body and Blood of Jesus Christ are good food to eat and good drink to drink. They feed us on the journey of living our Christian vocations. As Christians, we each bring to our vocation our time and gifts and once fed by the Body and Blood of Christ our time and gifts can be transformed into tools helping build up the Body of Christ, the Church.

Today we recognize and express gratitude to those who have offered their gifts and time for the various ministries in the parish. They help to build up the Body of Christ by firstly recognising their giftedness and then generously making them available to the parish community. We highlight particularly in today's Masses those involved in the areas of music in the liturgy, those who proclaim the Word and Special Ministers of the Eucharist.

The purpose of music in the liturgy is to give glory to God, and to help all of us to enter more fully into the sacred mysteries, to ponder God in our midst. God is present in Scripture, the Church's book of God's Word. Proclaiming the Word builds up the Body of Christ. The Eucharist is the Sacrament of unity, reconciliation and love. Being a minister of the Eucharist helps to feed the parish community both those who gather around the altar and also to connect the sick with that same parish community which has Christ at its centre.

When we receive Communion and we say, "Amen," it does not only mean, "Yes, I believe", but, "I will be you in the world." Each morning when we wake up it would be appropriate for each of us to ask these questions of Jesus: Where will I find your broken Body today? Shall I find your broken Body among the homeless or the sick? Shall I go to my own household or perhaps to someone from whom I need to seek forgiveness? Shall I look in my own workplace for the broken Body of Christ?

As we celebrate the Body and Blood of Christ today, it is good to be aware that our time together here is deeply connected with what happens beyond our church doors. The Eucharist calls us each day to practice searching for the broken Body of Christ and it is usually found in places near and familiar. The Eucharist is the food for the Christian journey. It is good food and good drink.
