June is the month to reflect upon the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Crudely put, devotion to the Sacred Heart helps us to appreciate that Jesus is God with skin on. The Sacred Heart makes divine love, human; interprets divine love in human language. Think of the episode in the Gospel where Jesus cured the mother of Simon Peter's wife. Afterwards, other people arrived who were afflicted with illnesses. What did Jesus do? He laid hands upon each of them. He gave personal, individual attention. That personal attention reveals something about God. For each one of us, God has this same individual concern and our Christian vocation calls us to show love to others.

In the Sacred Heart we get a glimpse of God's desire to be vulnerable. We see this in Jesus' reaction to the ingratitude of the nine lepers; his weeping over Jerusalem; his affection for Martha, Lazarus and Mary; his reaction to the betrayal by Judas. Again and again we meet a vulnerable Jesus in the Gospels. It seems that God became human to feel what we feel, to show that he understands.

Saint Bonaventure wrote beautifully of the Church being formed from the side of Christ on the cross. "(The) blood, which flowed from its source in the secret recesses of his heart, gave the sacraments of the Church power to confer the life of grace."

One of these sacraments is the Eucharist, where the chief shepherd with the big heart is humbly present with us. Saint John Mary Vianney wrote, "We know that Jesus is there in the tabernacle: let us open our hearts to him, let us rejoice in his sacred presence. That is the best prayer." Time spent with Jesus, vulnerable in the Eucharist helps us grow in compassion for others - the people of drought stricken East Africa, the victims of the many areas in the world where violence is part of life, the people hurting closer to home perhaps in our own families or work places.

The month of June invites us to make a connection between the head and the heart. If we have only knowledge about our faith but it is not integrated into our lives then we cannot love with the heart of Christ? Through faith-filled prayer and reflection we can become people of wisdom, aware of the tremendous love God has for each of us and then to use that wisdom to respond generously to people around us with charity, compassion and joy.

Sadly, a block to respond to people in this way can be fear; of rejection, of standing out from the group, or of simply not knowing how to respond. Jesus says in the Gospel today not to be afraid but to have confidence and to stand firm. Jesus, may my-heart-beat-beat-more-in-time-with-your-heart-beat.


