

Parish Preparation for the Archdiocesan Synod - Update

The Wellington Archdiocesan Synod will be held on the weekend of 15-17 September. Cardinal John has explained that preparation for the Synod should be "a discernment process, listening to the Spirit then to one another as we seek to understand where God is leading us."

Discernment involves reflection, not discussion or debate, and being open to the wisdom of the Holy Spirit, focusing on what we can do to help build our archdiocese of the future. Most Synod topics are drawn from Pope Francis' priorities - leadership, people at the edges of society and of the Church, ethnic diversity, relations with Māori, refugees and migrants, care for creation, ecumenism, young people, marriage and family.

At St Mary of the Angels we will follow a two-step process for parishioners to reflect on any of the topics and then share responses with your representatives so they can take these to the Synod.

First, during August we invite you to take time for prayer and meditation on the topics either individually or by arranging small groups with others. We will provide more details and support materials at the beginning of August.

Second, in September, we invite you to share your reflections with the parish representatives at meetings after masses or in writing if you prefer.

The St Mary of the Angels Young Adults will host an information and discernment session on Sunday, 30 July at 6.15pm in the St Mary of the Angels parish hall. It will be an opportunity to find out about the Synod, and get some initial thoughts. Some of our parish representatives to the Synod will be there.

Postcard Campaign in Opposition to Euthanasia Parliament Bill

You may be aware that David Seymour's private members bill in support of Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide has been drawn from the parliamentary ballot. This is a grave moral matter as the vague wording of the bill could allow virtually any New Zealander 18 years or older to access assisted suicide and euthanasia. It is vital we send a message to our local Member of Parliament letting them know that we oppose the bill. The Nathaniel Centre for Bioethics has organised a postcard campaign for all those who oppose the measure to send to their local MP. After all masses today there will be yellow post cards available for signing. You can sign and hand in your postcard today, or take the postcard home and send to Parliament free post.
