Saving Lives - Saving the Earth

Today is our day of prayer to respect life. Moral theologian, Father Neil Vaney, sm writes in this month's WelCom, "... the environment, life, sexuality, the family, and social relations are profoundly interlinked."

The theme of our recent Archdiocesan Synod was, "Go you are sent," and was an expression of the interconnectedness of Catholics in the Archdiocese and how we are linked to the wider community by our mission. We look forward to Cardinal John Dew's response to the submissions and at an appropriate time to a report from our own delegates.

Appreciating how everything is interlinked can be seen in the Gospel for today. In the Gospel, we hear a parable in which a landowner leases land to tenants. He has planted it with grapevines and set up the vineyard with all it needs for a successful vintage. Apart from the soil, adequate irrigation and sun, all it needs is care shown by the tenants and that they manage things well at harvest time. The problem is, they are not happy with the status of tenants; they want to be the owner.

The vineyard symbolizes the world and God is its owner. When people have a sense of entitlement and see themselves as the owners, problems arise. "Owners" in the sense of thinking they can do what they like for their own profit with little consideration for others. We see this attitude when the sanctity of life is not respected in so many ways in our world. We see it when some countries or multinational companies or wealthy individuals strip resources from poorer countries or supply weapons to line their own pockets while fueling further unrest.

Fortunately, there is a growing awareness among many good people that we all need to be good stewards of the earth. More people are seeing that the peoples of planet earth are interdependent and that the Author of creation calls us to burst out of our narrow points of view, limited dreams and individualistic ways of living life.

Teach us to discover the worth of each thing, to be filled with awe and contemplation, to recognize that we are profoundly united with every creature as we journey towards your infinite light. [Pope Francis, Laudato Si, on care for our common home, Vatican, 2015, #246]


