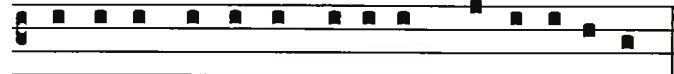

### Vespers for the Feast of All Saints In Memory of Leo Buchanan

Wednesday 1<sup>st</sup> November 2017 7:30pm

Vespers are sung three times a year by our choir, as a special celebration of the great feasts of Pentecost, the Assumption, and All Saints. The choir follows the form of the modern liturgy, with the set Gregorian hymn, the two psalms and Canticle sung in Latin to the traditional tones, and a setting of 'Magnificat' by Palestrina. After the liturgy, the choir sings some of the liturgical music especially written for the particular feast, and shares some other pieces from their repertoire. The liturgy usually lasts for 40 - 50 minutes, and the choir then sings for another 30 minutes. This year, we are honouring the memory of the late Leo Buchanan. Those of us who knew him, and who had a chance to be enlightened by his particular qualities of deep faith and crystal clear intellect, particularly evident in the Communion discussion group that he led, are warmly invited to attend. He had a particular love for the music of the traditional liturgy that we sing at the 11am Mass. In a conversation I had with him a few weeks before his death, he talked about planning the music for his funeral. In the event there wasn't time to continue the conversation, but he did mention that he would really like Vivaldi's Gloria, so we will sing the first movement of that, with one of the choir members, Vincent Brzozowski, a performance student at the NZ School of music, playing trumpet. We will also sing Victoria's music for All Saints, as well as music by Tavener and Pärt.
