



# **Euthanasia and Assisted Suicide Update**

David Seymour's 'End of Life Choice' bill has had its first reading in Parliament and has been referred to a Select Committee. The bill seeks to legalise euthanasia and assisted suicide in New Zealand for those over 18 years with a terminal illness or an irremediable condition. The bill passed its first reading by a significant margin of 76 votes to 44.

The Health Select Committee conducted an inquiry last year about the issues of euthanasia and assisted suicide, releasing their report in August 2017. Over 21,000 submissions were received, of which 80% were opposed to the legalisation of euthanasia and assisted suicide.

Legalising euthanasia or assisted suicide would endanger the lives and wellbeing of people who are vulnerable, including those suffering from mental health issues, elderly people, and the disabled.
