

The Journey of Holy Week

In our reading today from Mark's Gospel... the woman with the alabaster jar used her savings to buy very expensive ointment with which to anoint Jesus. Critics complained that the ointment, which was worth approximately a year's wages, should have been sold and the proceeds shared among the poor. But Jesus said that what the woman had done was right. Jesus goes further and predicts that the Good News of Christ will be proclaimed throughout the world and that her actions would be remembered. She was honoured Jesus while he was still there among them physically. There would be plenty of time for helping the poor.

Here we catch a glimpse of our true purpose – worshipping the divine. Our life journeys are to be underpinned by the greatest commandments - love God ad love our neighbour as ourselves. [Caritas Aotearoa New Zealand, Reflection Programme 2018, P.35]

On Palm Sunday we begin our journey through Holy Week in which we are invited to contemplate the great mysteries celebrated in the liturgies over these days. The opening prayer from today's Mass may help focus our contemplation: Almighty ever-living God, who as an example of humility for the human race to follow caused our Saviour to take flesh and submit to the Cross, graciously grant that we may heed his lesson of patient suffering and so merit a share in his Resurrection.
