

Vocations

The Feast Day of Saint Peter Chanel, Proto-martyr of the Pacific is on 28 April. As a congregation the Society of Mary (Marist Fathers) was approved in 1836 by Pope Gregory XVI on the condition that they would take the Gospel to the peoples of South Western Pacific. Peter was on the first voyage of Marist missionaries, being dropped off on the island of Futuna with Brother Marie Nizier Delorme in 1837 before the boat went onto New Zealand.

Traditionally in the Society of Mary we have a novena of prayer, (nine days) prior to the feast day to pray for priestly and religious vocations to the Society of Mary. We started the novena on Thursday and I invite you to focus some of your daily prayer, if you are not already, in these remaining days, on people discerning their vocation in life. We are each called to live our baptismal call in a particular way whether it be to marriage, as a committed single person, a consecrated lay person, as a religious such as Sister Frances, as a diocesan priest or as a religious priest such as the Marists who serve at St Mary of the Angels.

Living Christian discipleship with focus and passion from following one of these vocations is a grace. After all, we have only one shot at life and for some people it is very short as can be seen by the large numbers of people who have lost their lives in wars. We remember them this week on ANZAC Day and we pray for their souls.

Sadly, wars and injustices have not been eradicated despite the sacrifice by millions over the years. With the many troubles in our world, people of faith need to remain vigilant otherwise they can feel overwhelmed by seemingly hopeless situations. As Christians we need to believe with all our being that Jesus Christ has conquered the world and is with us to the end of time. The world needs us to be ambassadors of faith, hope, justice and love.

There are many ways to be a Christian ambassador and the novena of prayer prior to Saint Peter Chanel's Feast Day is one way to help fellow Christians to discover the pathway of Christian discipleship that God is calling them to.
