

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us. Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us

Walking up the main aisle towards the main doors of our church the statue of the Sacred Heart shows Jesus extending his loving arms as if to embrace the whole congregation. Here is an excerpt from reflections on the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary by the Superior General of the Society of Mary, Father John Larsen, sm, 1st June, 2018.

When Jesus was attacked his arms remained open and his heart was exposed. He was fatally wounded but these very wounds became sacred with divine love. As the Preface of the Feast says: "won over to the open heart of the Saviour, may all people draw water joyfully from the springs of salvation". His open, loving heart was the source of the blood of the Eucharist and the living waters of Baptism.

We also celebrate the Immaculate Heart of Mary, whose purity led to her Son's teaching: 'Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God". Mary reminds us that the love of the vulnerable heart is not concerned with ever more action, but rather a contemplative gaze - "purity of heart" - that opens us up to the love of God and to those who are struggling, offering them her maternal welcome.

And now, from an act of consecration to the Sacred Heart of Jesus by Father Brian Wysocki, sm.

... We know that your Heart is a symbol of the love you have for all peoples – whether they recognize you or not. From this Heart, Blood and Water flowed out as you hung upon the Cross on the First Good Friday — to be the price of our eternal salvation... we consecrate ourselves, our families, our friends, all our parish and the entire city to your most loving Heart. We know that you are not a God of vengeance, but of love. Draw all of us, without exception, to your most loving Heart. Give to those who are your faithful disciples, a Heart that is akin to yours. Then, like you, our love will have no bounds. Especially draw close to you those who labour under the shadows of sorrow, poverty, misunderstanding, rejection, prejudice or loneliness. May the love of your Most Sacred Heart also embrace those in need of conversion....

Mark 3:27 from today's Gospel: "But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first." The implication is to allow Jesus to be that strong man inside us.




