## Christianity, Refugees & Migrants

The New Zealand Catholic Bishops Conference has marked out today as a day of prayer for refugees and migrants. (See more details and resources at caritas.org.nz)

In the annual Papal message for the World Day of Migrants and Refugees, Pope Francis uses the verbs, to welcome, to protect, to promote and to integrate as appropriate Christian responses to every stranger for the sake of their fundamental dignity. [Message of His Holiness Pope Francis for the 104th World Day of Migrants and Refugees 2018, Vatican.]

There is a connection with our Gospel reading today [Mk 4:26-36]. The image of the mustard seed growing into a large shrub able to shelter the birds of the air reflects what many people around the world, including some in New Zealand, are doing for refugees and new migrants.

However, the Gospels make it clear that correctly responding to Jesus, accepting his invitation to love radically, is a stretch for ordinary consciousness. Our minds are pedestrian; his words are wings. He sees more in us than we do in ourselves. It is not easy to know yourself as a mustard seed and to be in the presence of someone who sees you as a sheltering tree of life.

There is a world within you

no one has ever seen. a voice no one has ever heard, not even you. As yet unknown you are your own seer, your own interpreter. And so, with eyes and ears grown sharp for voice or sign, listen well--not to these words but to that inward voice, that impulse beating in your heart like a far wave. Turn to that source, and you will find what no one has ever found. a ground within you no one has ever seen,

a world beyond the limits

of your dream's horizon.

## Caritas Emergency Appeal for the Rohingya Refugees in Bangladesh

Since August, 700,000 Rohingya have fled from Myanmar to Bangladesh. Many refugees have settled in a refugee camp in Cox's Bazar. Though the Rohingya are now safe from persecution and being supported by organisations on the ground, they are now faced with the risk of flooding from monsoon rains. Heavy rain and high-winds may destroy shelters, create landslides and pose health risks. Caritas is working with Caritas Bangladesh and others to build retainer walls, stronger shelters and to meet the needs of the Rohingya people.

As Pope Francis said, "embrace all those fleeing from war and hunger, or forced by discrimination, persecution, poverty and environmental degradation to leave their homelands." The Rohingya are an example of his message. Caritas invites you to stand in solidarity with the Rohingya by supporting our emergency appeal.
