Connecting with People Decreases Loneliness

There is a medical doctor in the United States who has a different approach to practising medicine. She runs workshops with other doctors using touch with healing intent. She tells the story of a patient who suffered painful complications from cancer treatment. The patient drove themselves the 35 kilometres to the hospital, stopping the car several times on the way to vomit. When the doctor asked her why she did not call any of her friends, she said they were all working and besides, "None of my friends knows a thing about [cancer]."

"Then why didn't you call me?" "Well it's not really your field either," she replied. The doctor responded, "Even children instinctively run to others when they fall down." "Yes, I've never understood that," the sick woman replied, "It's so silly. Kissing the [grazed knee] doesn't help the pain at all." The doctor felt moved to say, "it doesn't help the pain, it helps the loneliness." [John Shea, Eating with the bridegroom, Liturgical Press, Collegeville, 2007

The woman in the scripture who had suffered from a haemorrhage for 12 years would have experienced extreme loneliness in her life. Jesus, liberates her. We know from the conversation between the woman and Jesus that his divine nature is at work. God's love flows through to the woman at the deepest level of her being at the time of physical touch. The woman is ready to receive God's compassionate love.

Jesus makes clear to her that she has never been an unclean woman. She is a daughter of God who is suffering. She grasps this new identity with her whole being because she knows it is the truth and that her culture is wrong on this point. Now she can go forward and enjoy normal interpersonal relationships and community living.

What are ways that we can be more connected; in our families, in our parish, with people different from me in New Zealand? One small way can be done before going to sleep at night: Mention by name, in a prayer, everyone in your house, or at work, or people you have heard are suffering. Pray for someone whom you do not like. When we make an effort to be more connected, barriers and loneliness can break down, and we are more likely to become aware of our common identity, sons and daughters of God. Perhaps this week God wants to bring new life to someone who is lonely, disconnected and hurting through you and me.




Rosary
