

Danger of the Familiar

In Mark 6:1-6 the people of Jesus' home town were astonished and Jesus himself was amazed. It seems that when Jesus called into his hometown things did not go very smoothly. Before visiting Nazareth there had been evidence of Jesus' power in other districts: revelations, healings and exorcisms. From these examples of God's presence and power people in those parts were astonished and amazed and came to faith.

Things were different in Nazareth. In Nazareth people were astonished and took steps to reject Jesus. This man Jesus they thought they knew so well should be making tables, working with stone and leather, not speaking wisdom, curing the sick and casting out demons. In their minds they had boxed him in to being just as he was when he lived among them. The people seemed to have the belief that God only works through special people, learned people or official people. Mary's and Joseph's son was simply not eligible.

What they failed to realise is that one of their own sons, Jesus of Nazareth, had a close relationship with God the Father. Jesus relied on his Father.

The struggle Jesus experienced in Nazareth helps us with our own struggle. The second reading for today, 2 Corinthians 12:7-10 sheds some light for

In this reading St Paul writes about, "... a thorn in the flesh," that helps him from getting too proud. Whether this was a physical ailment or a speech impediment, it is not certain. It seems that it was a chronic condition, painful. Every person has a thorn in the flesh, whether it be physical, psychological or spiritual.

What Paul learns is that God's grace is sufficient for him and God's power is made perfect in weakness. Whatever is the thorn in the flesh that each of us has, God's grace is sufficient for us. Somehow the weakness of the Cross is a revelation of God's power. Our suffering can force us to rely on God. The tendency, however, is to rely on my own ego.

While the people of Nazareth could not put it into words what they were witnessing in Jesus, it unsettled them. What had happened is that one of their own was totally relying on God.
