Signs of God's Care

The crowd is intrigued. They saw the disciples get into a boat, but Jesus was not with them. They follow the disciples in their own boats. They eventually find Jesus and are mystified as to how he got from A to B. "... they found him on the other side." (In 6: 25) Jesus tries to redirect their inquiring minds: "I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat. Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life." (In 6:26-27) They are seeking him because they have filled their tummies with bread and fish. But they have not understood that the bread and fish are signs of God's care for people.

They are interested in spectacular phenomena. This is no surprise since the people are well acquainted with the constant, daily struggle to find enough food to live on but Jesus tells them that there is, in fact, a new manna, which is given by his heavenly Father. He is not denying that Moses gave the people manna many years before; he simply wishes to make it clear that the gift that Moses gave them pales in significance when compared to the nourishment that is now offered by his Father. Unfortunately, the people are less acquainted with how to satisfy their spiritual hunger than their physical hunger. Jesus tells them that he is the one who feeds them with eternal food.

To be attentive to the signs of God's care my consciousness needs to be unshackled from the visible, material and temporal if I desire to be conscious of God as the ultimate giver. Not giving in a Father Christmas sense of giving but giving tailored love which brings new life to individual people.

When the people mysteriously found Jesus on the other side of the lake their inquiring minds led them to ask questions. Having an inquiring mind is good for it can lead to an openness to the Holy Spirit who fuels our spiritual consciousness. With a growing, spiritual consciousness a person not only is more attentive to signs of God's care but is motivated to show care to others.
