## Pathway to Intentional Discipleship -**A Change of Consciousness**

Staying with Jesus is always a decision. To come to that decision involves a gradual shift in consciousness. A recent author I appreciate is Sherry Weddell and she uses the term Intentional Discipleship to describe this shift in consciousness, a shift that all Christians are called to grow in.

In her book, Forming Intentional Disciples - The Path to Knowing & Following Jesus, (Our Sunday Visitor Publishing Division, Indiana, 2012) Weddell describes a time in Europe when there was a great flowering of Christianity. There is the example of Francis de Sales in 1594 who set out to re-evangelise 60,000 people in the Chablais, alpine France. In the 1590s, Paris experienced a Catholic revival. It came from turning to prayer, penance, a life of serious, communal devotion and mission. (I.e. Intentional discipleship). The reformers were not trying to restore the pre -Reformation Church but bring a fresh approach including importing innovations from people such as Teresa of Avila (Spain), Philip Neri (Rome), the Confraternity of Catholic Doctrine (Milan), and Francis of Assisi who was renowned for his gentleness and trust in God (motto: Let us see what love will do).

The following generation led huge developments in organisational charitable works, evangelisation, missionary expansion, Catholic education and catechesis, renewal of the priesthood, parish, religious life and establishing the seminary system. There was also the French School of spirituality emphasising adoration, a personal relationship with Jesus and a rediscovery of the Holy Spirit. Vatican II drew from the French School – the universal call to holiness, the call of all the baptised to a personal relationship with Jesus at the heart of the Church and to apostolic witnessing. There was a flowering of new religious orders, many of them in Paris.

What can I learn from these saints and this great revival? They were intentional disciples. They were in mission together. They collaborated on a grand scale. They were present and future oriented. Apostolic creativity was the new normal. They expected God to act. They were deeply prayerful. They were faithful until death.



### Taste and see the goodness of the Lord


I will bless the Lord at all times, his praise always on my lips; in the Lord my soul shall make its boast. The humble shall hear and be glad. R.

### **Māori Pastoral Care Appeal**

The annual Māori Pastoral Care Appeal takes place on the weekend of 25-26 August 2018.

The Marist family has just been celebrating 200 years since a small group in Lyon made a great promise to found a religious project taking on the way of being of Mary, the mother of Jesus as a way of spreading the Gospel.

When that project got papal approval many of the early members of that group were sent to New Zealand to carry out their promise. Here with Bishop Pompallier their first promise was to work among Māori. Religious sisters and lay people also took on that promise. The mission has been carried out in various ways by many dedicated people across Aotearoa in parishes, schools, marae, home, hospital and prison visits. Māori themselves have taken up the work.

In the Archdiocese of Wellington each year we have a collection to help fund the work of the pastoral care of Māori, specifically the work done by the Vicar for Māori, (Deacon Danny Karatea-Goddard) and Kaiāwhina Māori (Rangimoeroa Waikari-Panapa). This collection is a way of funding some of the fulfilment of the promise. Specific ways of doing that are:

- •Assisting parishes, schools and communities with their knowledge of things Māori, use of te reo Māori in liturgies.
- •Helping with sacramental and leadership programmes for children and young people.
- Providing opportunities for Mass in Māori.
- •Assisting participation in Archdiocesan events, liturgies and celebrations.
