

# 16 September 2018, 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Who is Jesus? Wrestling with the question of Jesus' identity plays a part in deciding to live the Christian life. His activities of exorcising, proclaiming, teaching, and healing invite speculation. Ultimately these activities were revelations to humans of God's beautiful design. However, humans are all too often preoccupied with the "things of humans". When this happens the identity of Jesus slips into the shadows of one's priorities.

How do the "things of God" and the "things of humans" differ? David Rhoads suggests the following: The things of God are, faith, courage, losing one's life for the Good News, being least and being servant, and doing good. The things of humans are, lack of faith, fear, saving one's life, being great, lording it over people and doing harm. Reading Mark: Engaging the Gospel, Minneapolis: Fortress Press, 2004.7

In her book, Forming Intentional Disciples: The Path to Knowing and Following Jesus, Our Sunday Visitor, 2012, Sherry Weddell describes with detailed statistics the crisis of Catholics leaving the Church in the United States. She shares the evidence that most departures happen in young adulthood, and that most who leave never come back.

From Chapter 1, God Has No Grandchildren, she writes: If this trend does not change, in ten years it will cease to matter that we have a priest shortage. The Builders will be largely gone, the Boomers retiring, and our institutions – parishes and schools - will be emptying at an incredible rate.

She then explores possible reasons for the emptying of pews across all ages in ethnic groups. She discovered a sobering finding in surveys researching the beliefs of Catholics: The majority of adult Catholics are not even certain that a personal relationship with God is possible.

Is this too negative and not trusting that the Holy Spirit has the matter in hand? Or, is the way of the world stifling any possible enquiry into the "things of God" and possible relationship with him and thereby stifling the revelation of God's beautiful design?

Last Tuesday was the enquiry evening for possible candidates in our parish's Rite for Christian Initiation of Adults. Not only will we keep them, their sponsors and the leaders in our prayers but hopefully we will be motivated to go deeper with our relationship with Jesus Christ. Is it time for the parish to explore fresh ways to help parishioners make this journey?


