I read a spiritual writer once who referred to the mind as a good servant but a poor master.

There is the story of the student who asked the teacher, "Professor, do fish think?"

"Do fish think?" The professor repeated the question. "Let me see. There is a fish pond in the back of my house. Every evening for three weeks, I threw fish food in the water near the left bank. The fish came and ate. Then one evening I threw fish food into the pond near the right bank. I noticed the fish were still going to the left bank. For nearly three weeks I threw fish food near the right bank, but the fish were still going to the left bank. Then one evening the fish noticed the food was over at the right bank. They swam across the pond. But they were so starved from not eating, they rolled over and died right before they came to the food. Do fish think? Yes, but not fast enough.

By speaking of the mind as a good servant, spiritual writers are suggesting that by welcoming God's grace into our hearts we are able to keep our mind flexible and supple, we can hope and dream in the future but live in the present.

This suggests that we should hold our knowledge lightly, always countering it with not-knowing. If not, we run the risk of prejudging and not being open to the fullness of truth. This points to our need for constant metanoia, personal conversion. We should allow the Gospel message to form our thinking.

"John said to Jesus, Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him." [Mark 9:38]

The thinking of the disciples has led them to confuse Christian community with a club, or gang, pack or herd. Because they have met people outside of the group of disciples of Jesus who are doing good deeds they have concluded that the outsiders are a threat; that they might poach their territory. Their thinking needs to change. If Jesus is truly resident in their hearts then their minds need to search for ways to build bridges with these "outsiders".
