

7 October 2018, 27th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Some Pharisees question Jesus about his teaching on marriage and divorce. In response Jesus focusses on the unity created by marriage. He quotes Genesis 2:24: "Therefore a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and they shall become one flesh." The emphasis by Jesus on the unitive dimension of marriage opens up a central aspect of the vocation of Christian marriage. A beautiful role of Christian marriage in the world is to point to the bond of love between God and creation and the importance of reconciliation in our lives, to restore that bond where it is damaged.

In a recent Jesuit publication, I found the following spiritual exercise which may help us in our relationships: Reconciling God, Creation and Humanity: An Ignatian Examen.

In Laudato Si' Pope Francis asked us to care for creation and to reconcile our relationship with God, creation and one another. Borrowing from the great Ignatian tradition of Examens the following may be helpful in our personal prayer. Begin the Examen by placing yourself in a posture that allows yourself to be open to the ways the Spirit is working in you:

- 1] I give thanks to God for creation and for being wonderfully made. (Where did I feel God's presence in creation today?)
- 2] I ask for the grace to see creation as God does in all its splendour and suffering. (Do I see the beauty of creation and hear the cries of the earth and the poor?)
- 3] I ask for the grace to look closely to see how my life choices impact creation and the poor and vulnerable. (What challenges or joys do I experience as I recall my care for creation? How can I turn away from a throwaway culture and instead stand in solidarity with creation and the poor?)
- 4] I ask for the grace of conversion towards ecological justice and reconciliation. (Where have I fallen short in caring for creation and my brothers and sisters? How do I ask for a conversion of heart?)
- 5] I ask for the grace to reconcile my relationship with God, creation and humanity, and to stand in solidarity through my actions. (How can I repair my relationship with creation and make choices consistent with my desire for reconciliation with creation?)
- 6] I offer a closing prayer for the earth and the vulnerable in our society.


