

Writing on the Heart

The questioning of Jesus by a scribe in today's Gospel shows that not all religious leadership rejected him. Clearly, this man respected Jesus and wanted to know more.

In the Jewish Law there were over six hundred prescriptions so naturally there were questions about priority. How are they interrelated? Is there one that contains all the others? Clearly, there is as Jesus states:

"This is the first: Listen Israel, the Lord our God is the one Lord, and you must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind and with all your strength. The second is this: You must love your neighbour as yourself" (Mark 12:29-31)

The first commandment, the one from which all others flow, concerns the one God. Divine oneness is absolute, the creator of all. Therefore, people should imitate this oneness by bringing themselves into complete coordination with the One. The one God makes all people one so therefore, the neighbour must be loved as yourself.

This month provides us with the opportunity to show our love for a particular category of neighbour, our deceased neighbour. We pray in November for deceased family members and friends, for deceased parishioners, benefactors of the parish and deceased members of the choir. Let us also pray for those in the world who die alone and those who have no one to pray for them.
