

## 10 February 2019, 5th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It is fairly common in Aotearoa New Zealand to take pride in being able to stand on your own two feet and not having to rely on anyone else. Perhaps if a Kiwi was building a new deck they might conscript a close mate or two but all in all the survival/do-it-yourself mentality runs deep.

That approach to life makes it particularly difficult to see how the following words are possible: they left everything and followed him. [Luke 5:11b] What prompted the disciples of Jesus to abandon their jobs and follow Jesus?

What would prompt you to abandon your present job? Higher pay? the new job prospect being more connected with your skill base? An improved location? All of the above?

The people who featured in our Gospel account were of a culture used to banding together for mutual assistance. Sometimes it became necessary to reach out beyond the family and to form "family-like" bonds with others who could lend the help that family members could not. That person who would have surplus means would take on a patron's role.

By providing seasoned and experienced fishermen with a bountiful catch after a frustrating night of work, Jesus, could be viewed purely in terms as a patron. A patron is someone who can get for you something you could not obtain by your own abilities, or connect you with people who you could not otherwise hope to meet by yourself. The irony of course, is that Jesus was not a fisherman and yet he was the vehicle through which God's power caused the great catch.

The "everything" that they left included more than boats and nets. It included their social network, their social stability and in some ways, their family. They would have been considered crazy, unless ....

Unless they saw in this new patron, Jesus, something they could not get elsewhere. It is not entirely clear what the followers of Jesus saw. Certainly, it was more than fish. But it was the fish, that commodity that consumed large parts of their day and provided for the family and gave social standing, that Jesus used to convince them that he was the patron that they truly wanted, the one who could get for them what they really wanted.

I suppose that is a question to ponder, at my deepest level, what is it that I most want?


R. In the sight of the angels I will sing your praises, Lord.
