

24 February 2019, 7th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A cultural value evident in a number of parts of the world, including Jesus' culture, is reciprocity. This word describes a variety of give-and-take exchanges between individuals or villages, usually along one of three patterns.

- General reciprocity is a sharing of goods with no hope of return. This characterises family relationships. Parents meet the needs of their children but do not keep a strict accounting of the child's debt. Their motive is love. It is enough that the child reciprocates with love and gratitude.
- Balanced reciprocity characterises neighbourly relations. Needs are met in a mutually beneficial manner. Lending now in the secure hope of being repaid or being able to borrow from the same person at a future time. Inviting someone to a meal with the implication that there will be an invitation in return.
- Negative reciprocity characterises relations with strangers. It is a relationship in which one party hopes to take advantage of the other party, to gain without having to repay anything at all. This is not to be confused with hospitality where hosts protect strangers from relationships of negative reciprocity and engage instead in a general reciprocity with their guests. They expect no return.

The advice given by Jesus in Luke 6:27-36 is directed to the privileged. Only the privileged would have a cloak and a tunic, or would have surplus wealth to lend. Jesus is asking the privileged to behave towards strangers just as they would behave toward members of their own household. He is urging the haves to treat the have-nots as if they were family. He discourages negative reciprocity, that is, the attempt by the privileged to take advantage of those in need.

Jesus is giving a window into his heart, a heart in which only love and truth can be found. He is also teaching that cultures, in all their rich forms around the world, are relative to the love and truth of Jesus Christ. The Gospel of Jesus Christ gives the standard.
