

# 21 April 2019, Easter Sunday

On Thursday of Holy Week at sundown, Lent ended. The Paschal Triduum of the Passion and Resurrection of the Lord began with the evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday. On Good Friday, we heard from the Gospel of John in which Jesus boldly yet humbly rebukes those who oppose him. When the soldier slaps him and Jesus says: "If there is something wrong in what I said, point it out; but if there is no offence in it, why do you strike me?"

In John's Gospel, Jesus does not suffer silently; he has a commanding presence. In fact, Jesus reveals the glory of God from the cross as he "reigns" there as King and "hands over" the Spirit when he dies and so the Church begins! The conquering Christ.

With Christ reigning and the Spirit in the Church, Christ is still active now. At each celebration of the various Sacraments, we are encountering the Risen

We will go from this Easter celebration, with the freshly blessed baptismal water upon us. I invite us to go with a renewed awareness of the fire of God's love within us: the power of the Holy Spirit and the Light of Christ. Let us defy the culture of death and darkness active in our present time. A culture in the world that too often promotes violence to the vulnerable and an eye for an eye, tooth for a tooth mentality. This is not the message of the Easter Jesus. Let us claim our identity of being beloved daughters and sons of God, called, anointed and sent to bring about a culture of life, justice and peace in the world; a culture of hope, gladness and rejoicing. As we do that may our motivation be to inspire people who do not know God to become friends of Jesus Christ, the Son of God, Risen and the light of the world.

Part of our Easter joy stems from the way God has touched the lives of **Daniel** Brady, James Heine, Jason Chappell and Sarah Boyle who have been journeying through the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults.

Daniel and James were Catechumens and were baptised, received First Communion and Confirmation at the Easter Vigil. Jason and Sarah were Candidates and received First Communion and Confirmation. Diego Jose Cardona Triviño has been preparing individually to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation and received that Sacrament at the Vigil. May they all continue to feel welcome in the Catholic Church and discover their place in God's mission here on earth.

I sincerely thank the R.C.I.A. team of Jane Ellis, Carolina Cazares, Father Joe Savesi and Father Kevin Mowbray for leading the programme and for the prayerful support given by the Sponsors.
