

# 19 May 2019, 5th Sunday of Easter

"[Paul and Barnabas] put fresh heart into the disciples, encouraging them to persevere in the faith." (Acts 14:22)

This line from our first reading struck me while preparing for our celebration of the Fifth Sunday of Easter. Struck me because Paul and Barnabas knew that perseverance in the faith cannot be taken for granted. Perseverance is unlikely if the faith is allowed to slip from consciousness, if effort is not put into growing in the faith or if opposition to Christian belief makes it seem just too hard to hold firm to the faith; easier to blend in with the group.

What do we mean by faith? The word 'faith' has two meanings. It can mean our act of believing or it can mean, what we believe – the set of beliefs which constitute our beliefs.

In the first sense, it is amazing that God invites us into a loving relationship. Our response is expressed in our act of belief. The second sense of the meaning responds to the question, "What do Catholics believe?" The simplest answer is that there is a God who loves us and cares for us like a father; a God who nourishes, strengthens and guides us; a God of immeasurable mercy who became one with us so that we might become one with God.

There Is a popular evangelistic Christian song, I Have Decided to Follow Jesus which has the line, "The Cross before me, the World Behind Me." This could either mean that belief in God profoundly influences how we view and live in the world or, that because the world is so evil I do not want to have anything to do with it. The words of the Our Father, ...thy Kingdom come, they will be done, on earth as it is in heaven, remind us that God is very interested in our world and that we have a part to play in bringing about God's Kingdom here on earth. The Christian is in the world but not of it.

This is where perseverance in the faith comes in. If we do not work at our faith then two things can happen. We can be consumed by the pleasures of this world and seek meaning from those pleasures or we can be overwhelmed by our powerlessness to prevent suffering and so fall into despair. Faith in a loving God who loves with a personal love ensures that we be a wise traveller and not a foolish traveller through life.

Pope St Gregory the Great – "The charms of prosperity must not lead us astray; for only a foolish traveller, when he sees pleasant fields on his way, forgets to go on towards his destination."

# St Mary of the Angels - Another Award

Last week we heard the good news that our architects, Bulleyment Fortune Architects and Ian Bowman, Architectural Conservator, Architect in association won gold at the New Zealand Architectural Awards for their work on our church. The citation includes the following: In many ways, St Mary of the Angels is the pinnacle of achievement for Wellington religious architecture, and an expression of faith in the pinning of buildings to the side of rocky outcrops. The restoration and strengthening of the church has been a labour of love for many. Through subtle, understated and almost invisible measures, including this century's only new Gothic flying buttresses, the late Denis Fortune has brought Frederick de Jersey Clere's brilliant design into the modern seismic code era.
