

2 June 2019, The Ascension of Our Lord

Feast of the Ascension

Today we celebrate the feast of our Lord's Ascension. "While they were looking on, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him from their sight," as the 1st Reading says. We celebrate Jesus' promise to Mary Magdalene when he said, "I am ascending to my Father and your Father, to my God and your God." John 20. The feast of the Ascension is a solemnity that sustains the hope of Christians that one day we will be where he is.

The Ascension is an ending and a beginning. Goodbyes are generally quite painful. So too it is with today's Gospel of the Ascension. One thing that strikes us about this goodbye is, that it isn't an unhappy one.

What did the Disciples do once Jesus said his goodbyes and was gone? They went back joyous in their praise of God. For them this was a happy time - a time to be glad. As the Psalm reminds us "All peoples clap your hands cry to God with shouts of joy."

The ascended Jesus defines a new beginning for our relationship with God, as it did with his Disciples. Who a short time before, were in hiding after they had seen Jesus their friend suffer and then put to death on the cross. They were afraid. Even after the Resurrection, they were worried what Jesus would say to them, knowing how much they had let him down, how they denied him, deserted and doubted him.

Our failures are no barrier to God's love for us. As Jesus assured his disciples that their failures didn't change his love for them. We also should take consolation in this. As St Paul says, "Nothing can separate us from the love of God in Christ."

There are times when we feel we are unable to pray, anxious over things we have done and left undone. We too need to come from the locked room of our anxieties, and come out into the world. We are the church, we are Christ's body, we continue his work, as he has commanded us to do. "I tell you; Go out to the whole world and spread the Good News."

Therefore, the Ascension marks the beginning of the fulfilment of Christ's promise to us. Jesus reminds us that irrespective of our knowledge and human capabilities we need a divine help in order to succeed, this divine help will come from the Holy Spirit to whom we must pay attention at all time.


Recipes for Restoration
