

# 28 July 2019, 17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Hopefully when we learn and recite a prayer like the Lord's Prayer, over time we grow in appreciation of the words and the community is strengthened. The risk is that these prayers are spoken mindlessly and we forget what prayer is — **prayer** is the inner being of the human person in communion with God.

Leo Tolstoy wrote the following story: A bishop, travelling by ship, is told that three hermits are living on a nearby island. He finds the hermits and asks them if they are Christian. They wholeheartedly respond, "Yes!" He inquires how they pray and they tell him, "When we pray, we say, "We are three. You are three. Have mercy on us." The bishop is horrified and instructs them in the Lord's Prayer. They do their best but they are slow to learn. Finally, the bishop returns to his ship, and departs.

On another trip the bishop is sailing past the same island. Later that evening, while strolling on deck, the bishop sees a ball of light come out of the island and move towards the ship. The bishop sees the three hermits are within it. They speak from within the sphere to the bishop and tell the bishop that they have forgotten some of the Lord's Prayer. They need him to reinstruct them. The bishop comes to an awareness of the holiness of the hermits, a holiness more profound than the correct recitation of words. The humbled bishop merely says, "Go home and when you pray, say, You are three. We are three. Have mercy on us." [John Shea, The Relentless Widow, Liturgical Press, Minnesota, 1992, P.213]

#### The Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary

On **15 August** we celebrate Mary being taken to heaven, body and soul. It is a **Holy Day of Obligation,** as each Sunday is. In New Zealand, the only other Holy Day which is not celebrated on a Sunday every year is Christmas.

The Assumption is also the patronal feast of Aotearoa New Zealand. The origin of this is when Bishop Pompallier entrusted the Roman Catholic mission to Our Lady of the Assumption. When you are next in Auckland visit the Cathedral of St Patrick and St Joseph and spend a few minutes contemplating the large stained-glass window behind the main altar of the Assumption.

Please invite family and friends to come along and celebrate what God has done and continues to do through Mary. Let us also use the opportunity to honour Mary and thank her for showing us how to be a disciple of her Son.
