

# **Our Parish: Looking Ahead**

During the time our church was closed for seismic strengthening a team of people performed the monumental task of keeping the parish ticking over using four different venues around the city. St Mary of the Angels reopened at Easter 2017 with much publicity and celebration. Since then there has been a palpable energy among the Pastoral Team and some members of the parish for rebuilding the parish community and growing the parish.

Our Archdiocesan Synod representatives (Catherine Keating, Suzanne O'Rourke, John Kennedy-Good, Sarah Pinto and Jane Ellis), generously gave of their time and prayerfully discerned how the fruits of that gathering could be applied to our unique context here in Boulcott St. We are grateful for their service. The Stewardship Day with our Archbishop, Cardinal John, fleshed this out further and more recently we held a successful parish meeting in the hall. One of the fruits of that meeting was the support for reforming a structure in the parish that has been absent for some years – a Parish Pastoral Council (PPC).

What is a Parish Pastoral Council? It is a team of parishioners who have a mission, a vision and a particular service to perform.

Mission: To take responsibility for what the parish is and does.

<u>Vision</u>: In consultation with the parishioners they plan where the parish should be going and how to make it happen.

Service: They inspire other parishioners and draw on their talents and gifts.

While the council should reflect the diversity of the parish no member represents a particular group. Therefore, each member represents the whole parish.

Why have a PPC? The reason is because while our parish is made up of different parts, St Mary of the Angels is one body: the Body of Christ. We are the People of God called to work together and continue the mission of Jesus Christ in the world. In the Archdiocese of Wellington, it is also a requirement to have a PPC.

What does a PPC do? It is responsible for the "big picture". It works with the Pastoral Team to plan and foster pastoral activities. The main functions are: 1) agree on a pastoral plan, 2) collaborate with volunteers to bring the plan to fruition, 3) evaluate the results.

At our parish meeting two weeks ago, I was heartened with the support for the following strategy: to re-establish the structure of a Parish Pastoral Council, I would invite 5-8 parishioners to form the PPC. This body would be an interim body, lasting for two years.

#### **Church Guardians**






