

#### THE COMMON TOUCH

A little known story about David Lange, New Zealand's prime minister in the 1980's:

I was working in the Philippines in 1986 when President Ferdinand Marcos was replaced by Cory Aquino, with the help of 'People's Power'. Soon afterwards David Lange, as prime minister, went on a long-planned visit to China. Taking advantage of that visit he hastily added a trip to the Philippines in order to meet President Aquino. In his luggage was a rolled-up bundle of newspapers addressed to me. Arriving in Manila he handed the bundle to the New Zealand ambassador there and told him to make sure that I received it. The bundle of newspapers was from my mother! She had sent it to David Lange's office after reading about his intention to visit President Aquino. She did this to save herself the spiralling cost of postage – an issue she had lengthily and entertainingly debated with David Lange at a public meeting during the recently-finished election campaign!

How many other world leaders would even bother with such a request? Can we imagine the president of the United States or the prime minister of Great Britain doing the same as David Lange? Yet somehow, deep down, we kiwis expect our leaders to act like that - to have the common touch.

Jesus was such a leader. All through his three years of public ministry he had the common touch. He walked everywhere, slept wherever he could and ate whatever was put in front of him. He worked in the midst of and for ordinary people.

Jesus' common touch reveals the heart of God – out of love for us God has become our servant. He does not come amongst us as a celebrity, a rock-star or a power-broker. His life and death reveal a profound truth about God. He prefers to be hidden, even unknown, in our midst. Our God is humble.

Today, in our Gospel reading, Jesus challenges us to be like Him in all we do or say - to be humble, to have the common touch!

Tall poppies don't thrive in New Zealand! People who are full of themselves, who think they are important, often get cut down to size. That's why, as kiwis, the story about David Lange resonates with us. And long may this be so! Even more deeply, though, it should resonate with us as Christians, disciples of Jesus.

By the way, my mother voted for David Lange in the following election!


