

# 8 September 2019, 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Reading today's Gospel sounds very harsh to me, I can't imagine hating my brothers and sisters. We are a close family! Does the Lord really mean that I have to hate them?

The cost of discipleship is a hard reality. Perhaps this is the reason Jesus used the word hate. Discipleship becomes harder when it would demand that I hate my own life. Jesus stresses emphatically that following him is not a part time commitment. It must be a full time commitment. This includes leaving those I love and cherish in life. My priority is to follow the Lord. It also means sacrificing possessions and relationships. His vision and mission become my own and priority.

Today is the feast of Mary's birthday. Being a feast on a Sunday, Sunday takes precedence. The Church celebrates three birthdays of importance: Mary's birthday on 8 September, the birth of Christ on Christmas Day, and John the Baptist's birthday on 24 June. This Friday the 12th we also celebrate the Holy Name of Mary, a special feast for our Marist communities. Let us pray and keep our Marist Community in prayer and thank God for the work they do here at St Mary of the Angels and beyond. This is a chance also to pray for vocations to priesthood and religious life. The 8th of September is also is my profession day—62 years.

Mary the Mother of Jesus has always occupied a special place in the hearts of Catholics. Orthodox Christians also celebrate her birthday as one of the 12 "great feasts" of the Orthodox Church. In recent years, the surge of interest in women's roles in the Church have led many of our non-Catholic friends to a fresh and deeper appreciation of Mary. She is also venerated by Muslims—in every Muslim mosque a prayer niche in the wall is dedicated to Mary.

It is very appropriate then, in these times of great suffering and peril for humanity that we invoke Mary in prayer in the Rosary, and in the Angelus which is said each day for the protection of the unborn child. Mary is our advocate, let us ask her intercession and protection in our daily life.
