

Good Things Come in Threes

Here is the Gospel for today's Sunday Mass. It is the 'agenda' for today and for the week ahead. After you've greeted our Lord and prayed that you may be one with him in this Mass, read over this Gospel. It's a good way to be focussed or 'ready' for the Mass.

The tax collectors and the sinners, were all seeking the company of Jesus to hear what he had to say, and the Pharisees and scribes complained, 'This man,' they said, 'welcomes sinners and eats with them.' So he spoke this parable to them: 'What man among you with a hundred sheep, losing one, would not leave the ninety nine in the wilderness and go after the missing one till he found it? And when he found it, would he not joyfully take it on his shoulders and then, when he got home, call together his friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," he would say, 'I have found my sheep that was lost." In the same way, I tell you, there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one repentant sinner than over ninety-nine virtuous men who have no need of repentance. 'Or again, what woman with ten drachmas would not, if she lost one, light a lamp and sweep out the house and search thoroughly till she found it? And then, when she had found it, call together her friends and neighbours? "Rejoice with me," she would say, 'I have found the drachma I lost." In the same way, I tell you, there is rejoicing among the angels of God over one repentant sinner.' (Luke 15: 1-10)

Did anything stand out? Or puzzle you? Think about those things. What could they mean? Tell our Lord. Then ask that this Gospel might be food for your soul today.

If you still have time before Mass, here is a bit of background. These stories go together as 'the lost sheep, the lost coin and the lost son and brother'. Yes the parable of the 'prodigal son' or 'lost son' follows directly on. Being grouped as a threesome is important. It is a common biblical practice to group in threes things that throw light on each other. For example, I'll make three points: 1) God is likened variously to a shepherd, a woman, and then a father. 2) But all three of them are 'over the top' in their reaction. (This threefold repetition indicates to us something important.) 3) Finally, the simple stories of the sheep and the coin prepare the way for the much more profound third story of the lost son and brother.




