WHO ARE WE TO JUDGE?

Today's parable was delivered to some people who prided themselves on being virtuous and despised everyone else. Although the parable is very brief, its message strikes home powerfully. The power of this famous parable of the pharisee and the tax-collector comes from its never-failing relevance. Society is still marked by the presence of divisions between people who think they are better than anyone else, and the other end of the scale: the despised ones. Nowhere in society is this division more marked than among people who claim to some form of religion.

The portrait of the pharisee is a caricature of the 'good man.' There is nothing that the pharisee does or says which is wrong. He stands for prayer because standing is the proper position for prayer. He thanks God and speaks of his life of care for other people. His only mistake is that he makes a judgment call on the publican: "Thank you, God, that I am not grasping, unjust, adulterous like the rest of mankind, and particularly that I am not like this tax-collector." However, he could be excused for that. The tax-collectors had, after all, sold their souls to the foreign rulers of the land so that they could make money from the sufferings of their fellow-Jews. The pharisee is a good man, and he is proud of it. He has managed to do all that God might ask of him.

The publican's position for prayer, bowed and beating his breast, is unusual. He has no great virtues, no religious success story to thank God for. He can only ask for God's mercy, recognising his sins. Jesus comments that this is the one who "went home at rights with God." This is so because the publican is honest, while the pharisee has not really looked into his heart.

The truth of the parable lies in the fact that we are all sinners. There is no one who does not need to kneel humbly before God and ask for His love and mercy. There is no one like the pharisee. Who could truthfully lay claim to all the success stories that the pharisee confesses to? There are only people who think they are that good, and they are the unfortunate ones in the eyes of God. Again, the pharisee is needy because he thinks he has it all. In such an approach to God, there is no place for a God who fills our emptiness. When we recognise our shallowness and superficiality we can be filled with the good gifts of God.


