## 10 November 2019, 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### OF ROSARIES AND EUTHANASIA

Nine years ago my mother died at the age of ninety-three. She was an 'old-school' catholic all her life. She went to Mass every Sunday, confession regularly and was active in the Catholic Women's League. She and Dad made sure that all seven of their children received a catholic education. She even attempted occasionally to make her squirming children pray the rosary together. She wasn't that successful. In fact, so unsuccessful was she that when I went to the seminary I, rather embarrassingly, didn't know the names of the various decades of the Rosary! Despite that failure she never stopped praying the rosary herself. Her beads were never far from her fingers wherever she was.

Not too many years before she died my mother told me of a visit she had made to one of my married sisters. Mum was praying the rosary when one of her grandson's asked who that little man was on the cross. As she told me the story sadness filled her eyes. I thought of her determined, life-long effort to hand on the Faith. In just two generations all that had come to nothing. So much that once was so valued had just disappeared. Can something lost so quickly ever be recovered?

That question came to my mind again very recently in a completely different context. This year we have seen two pieces of legislation progress through Parliament that will change how we think of life itself - the law governing abortion and the law introducing euthanasia. Changes like this would never have been contemplated when I was growing up. How did we reach this point? What have we lost within a generation or two? Can we ever recover?

In the midst of the 2007 stock market crisis a finance adviser stoically remarked to me, 'You are where you are' – in other words, acknowledge the reality of the world and act accordingly. My ever-practical mother would have agreed with him. But she also would have held on to her rosary beads! Her faith, undimmed by her grandson's question, nourished her certain hope that God, though hidden, was still in charge.

I recommend the wisdom of both the financial adviser and my mother to you. The medieval English mystic, Julian of Norwich, anticipated their wisdom so many centuries ago when she wrote, 'all shall be well, all shall be well and all manner of things shall be well'.

Is such a refrain our rock of consolation in these sad and difficult times?


