THE LORD COMES TO RULE THE EARTH WITH JUSTICE

As we get older we grow more aware how short life is, and before long we will be faced with the moment of death. How literally should we take what Jesus says today about the end of time? Our liturgy says he will come to judge the living and the dead. We hear so many say the end of time is coming, with floods, fires and global warming.

We hear in today's Gospel Jesus warning us of the destruction of the Temple, of wars, earthquakes, of persecutions and hatred towards his followers, not to be frightened, but in fact to strengthen, encourage and give us hope. Let us not fear the end of the world, nor the end of Christianity, or drown the Good News. Jesus' promise is to be with us till the end of time. Even though Jesus used the idea of Judgement day to turn people's hearts back to God, he also said, "no one knows the date or time, not even the Son, but the Father only."

Jesus' listeners were shocked when he said, "all that you see here - the days will come when there will not be left a stone upon another stone that will not be thrown down."

The atrocities done in our world are varied, and gross. Who would not think of the many sufferings that our sisters and brothers in the faith have to bear simply because they are believers of Christ? This is a time when we can pray not only for the deliverance of all, including also those committing crime against religious freedom.

Jesus spoke of the destruction of the Temple, a symbol that represents the presence of God among the Jews; it was to give way to a new spiritual temple - the mystical body of Christ. That Church Jesus promised, no one can destroy; not even the gates of hell can overcome it.

Jesus would not exempt his followers from tribulations. In fact, bearing the name of Christ makes us targets for persecutions and hatred. Jesus said, such would not be the end. Instead he has promised to be with us.

We are at all times to testify and be witnesses to the Lord. Witnessing means not causing harm or evil towards others, but assisting all who suffer. Should tribulations come our way, we witness by our patient endurance. Endurance comes from a firm trust that God suffers with us and is with us at all times.

In all the trials of the future, Jesus will be our support. Even if some will lose their lives, none will be finally lost, for by their endurance they will find their lives.

Our persecutors can take all from us, but they cannot take God from our hearts. Such is the persevering faith we have been blessed with. Live each day as though it were our last! We pray for a deepening of our love and faith in the Lord.


