

WARNING! CORONA VIRUS CHANGES EUCHARISTIC PRACTICE!

The news coming from China these past days is both sad and disturbing. A powerful virus which can be fatal has begun to spread very quickly amongst the people living in the city of Wuhan and beyond. There are justified fears that it has already been spread to other countries through tourists and business travelers. Various Governments around the world are already taking precautions at points of entry to their countries. Further measures are being contemplated.

As Catholics we have a duty of care for each other, not only as citizens but also brothers and sisters in the faith, when such health emergencies develop. Consequently, I sought the advice of the Parish Liturgy Committee as to how we should exercise our duty of care at masses celebrated in the church.

Therefore, from today, the 2nd of February, and until further notice, only the priest will drink from the chalice at each mass. Everyone else, including the Eucharistic Ministers, will receive only the host. This is to ensure that the risk of transmitting the corona virus is minimized as far as is possible.

I also sought advice about the Kiss of Peace which we exchange at all masses since many choose to offer the Kiss of Peace through the gesture of a handshake. Some wondered if this should be modified in the present context.

It is possible to offer the Kiss of Peace by other gestures. One such gesture would be to bow the head slightly towards the person to whom you are offering the Lord's Peace. Bowing the head in this manner could be accompanied by a joining of the hands as in prayer. This would already be familiar to many who worship at St Mary of the Angels because it is part of their cultural heritage. It is the way of greeting people in some Asian countries where it indicates great respect for the inner dignity and worth of the person to whom the gesture is made. Such a gesture could even become a permanent and accepted way of sharing the Kiss of Peace in our celebrations of the Mass. Why not? It is such a beautiful and gentle gesture which has much to commend it when compared to our often-casual handshake!

Whilst we limit the way we receive the Eucharist we should remain aware of two important realities: the first is that we still receive the fullness of Our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ through the host alone; and, secondly, we must pray for all those affected by the virus and the medical professionals who are caring for them
