

8 March 2020, 2nd Sunday of Lent

The second week of our journey through Lent is the Transfiguration of Jesus on the mountain.

A week before was the temptation of Jesus, then he announced his passion to the disciples and their part in it. The transfiguration followed closely, in order to confirm the faith of the three Apostles who would witness his sufferings. They were given a glimpse of Jesus as to what he would be in the future. His face already threatened by death's shadow, is transformed into the light of Easter. The vision is too beautiful to last or even to be expected. Moses and Elijah, two witnesses of the Old Testament testify by their presence to the last days, and to the arrival of the great prophet so long awaited. God the Father was also present in the cloud when he announced, "This is my Son the Beloved, listen to Him."

Soon it is time to come down from the mountain and continue in the footsteps of the servant. Soon the darkness of Calvary will obscure the brightness of that face, and it will not invite a second glance or reflect any hope. The transfiguration was no fantasy or dream. The dawn of Easter will reveal that life itself can rise from the dead. Jesus himself has began that great exodus; so have his disciples. Have we?

There will be challenges of all kinds in our own lives, but looking back at the time when we were at the highest peak, is a must if only to remind us of that very special moment when we most felt that special relationship between us, God and the community around us.

Our relationship with God and each other is a journey. There are many spiritual experiences that are our own "mountain-top experience" just like the Apostles during Jesus' Transfiguration. They do not happen every day. The Transfiguration gave Jesus a foretaste of his glory, and in the strength of that joy he endured the cross and despised the shame. With our own mountaintop experience, may we also endure the day to day crosses that are attached to our callings.


