29 March 2020, 5th Sunday of Lent

Here we are in the 5th week of Lent. Are you surprised! Palm Sunday, Holy Week next week, then Easter! What has been our preparation for this wonderful celebration of Easter? Or is it just another holiday to look forward to.

Today, we hear the story of Lazarus in John's Gospel. Jesus has a great love for Lazarus, Mary and Martha, as He does for each one of us. Jesus has come to bring that love of God to us and help us understand that he has come to show that love in the ordinariness of our lives.

Martha rushes out to meet Jesus, also annoyed that he comes when Lazarus has died. Jesus is aware of the illness of Lazarus, he could have healed him like he did for so many others. She is hoping that he will do something special. Jesus said to her 'your brother will rise''. Jesus says to her," I am the resurrection and the life, whoever believes in me, even if he dies, will live, and everyone who lives and believes in me will never die." He means exactly what he says - that he himself can give eternal life to all who come to him and believe in him.

They go to the tomb, Jesus weeps. For what does Jesus weep? He weeps for the fact that this world is a rough and cruel place. People's lives are full of loneliness and difficulties. There are many fears, even in this day we seem to have material things at our beck and call, our hearts hunger and sometimes fear for what we are being caught up with. We were created to love. That is what Jesus says in the Gospel. God loves us and cares for us. God is so concerned for us that he sent his only Son to walk with us and to accept the pain which was born of that love, even to the point of dying on the cross for us.

The Gospel of John is to prepare us for the passion and death of Jesus. Lazarus is a sign and symbol of the truth of every human being, that we are not created for a time, die and disappear into nothingness, but we are created to love God and to love each other.

For it is the mourning and weeping of Jesus- he does not weep over himself, he weeps over us, that we may finally bring this world and each other to a world that it was created for; a world of forgiveness, a world of caring, a world not without its problems, but a world based on the faith of Martha. Martha doesn't say do something, but when she sends her message to Jesus, she says "Master, someone you love is sick".

Sunday's Readings

First Reading Ezekiel 37:12-14

The Lord says this: I am now going to open your graves; I mean to raise you from your graves, my people, and lead you back to the soil of Israel. And you will know that I am the Lord, when I open your graves and raise you from your graves, my people. And I shall put my spirit in you, and you will live, and I shall resettle you on your own soil; and you will know that I, the Lord, have said and done this—it is the Lord who speaks.

Out of the depths I cry to you, O Lord, Lord, hear my voice!
O let your ears be attentive to the voice of my pleading. **R**

Second Reading Romans 8:8-11

People who are interested only in unspiritual things can never be pleasing to God. Your interests, however, are not in the unspiritual, but in the spiritual, since the Spirit of God has made his home in you. In fact, unless you possessed the Spirit of Christ you would not belong to him. Though your body may be dead it is because of sin, but it Christ is in you then your spirit is life itself because you have been justified; and if the Spirit of him who raised Jesus from the dead is living in you, then he who raised Jesus from the dead will give life to your own mortal bodies through his Spirit living in you.

Gospel Reading John 11:1-45

The sisters sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message, Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting I the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that, even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

I am the resurrection and the life. If anyone believes in me, even though he dies he will live, and whoever lives and believes in me will never die. Do you believe this?

'Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into the this world.'

Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'Lord, come and see.' Jesus wept; and the Jews said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening. Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him' Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:
