

Alert Level I Parish Guidelines

Thank you for your understanding and cooperation with the guidelines that have been in place in the parish. Now that we are in alert level 1, there are no restrictions to numbers at Mass but we must still adhere to certain measures—please read the following guidelines from Cardinal John Dew:

These recent guidelines from the Bishops for our liturgical practices remain in place for the meantime:

- Holy Communion The faithful are to receive Holy Communion in the hand only, and not from the chalice.
- Sign of Peace The exchange of peace can be by spoken word, by a gesture such as bowing, or by a pause for silent prayer for peace. At this stage people should not feel obliged to shake hands.
- Holy Water Fonts are to remain without Holy Water.

These guidelines will be re-evaluated as further health advice is given, or in one month's time. The dispensation from Sunday Mass remains in place for this weekend. People should stay home if they are sick, and contact their doctor if they have flu-like symptoms.
