

REST FOR OUR SOULS

So much is said about Jesus. He works miracles and He commissions His disciples to follow Him in His mission. Jesus is to be the focal point for the life of the disciple. The way of telling the story could lead the reader of the Gospel to lose sight of the centrality of God in the Christian life: "the One who sent" Jesus. This concern is averted in today's Gospel, as Jesus points away from Himself towards His Father. Everything Jesus says and does comes from His Father: "Everything has been entrusted to me by my Father." The learned and the clever are unable to reach beyond what they see happening before their eyes. They do not even wonder about the more profound mystery of the God and Father of Jesus who sent Him.

Some, however, do not need to be able to control all the answers with their own schemes. These are the ones who are not full of themselves and their own abilities and achievements. The image of "mere children" is carefully chosen. To be a child does not mean to be ignorant or irresponsible. It means to adopt that receptive attitude of a child to whom everything is new. Children wait, with an open mind and an open heart, to receive all the wonderful new things that happen and are said each day. They have space in their hearts, their minds and their lives to receive the gifts which are given to them. Thus it is with true followers of Jesus. They too have space in their hearts, their minds and their lives to receive the gifts the Father gives them. The greatest of all these gifts is His Son.

In today's Gospel Jesus expresses one of the main beliefs of the Christian Faith. The Father of Jesus would be unknown, were it not for Jesus His Son. Jesus knows the Father and makes Him known to us. Without Jesus, the deepest longings of all women and men would not have their ultimate answer: the God and Father of Jesus who is also our God and Father. By means of His life, teaching, death and resurrection, by means of His "story" Jesus has made the unseen God known to us. Have we made space to receive that knowledge?

In the time of Jesus it was thought that one could only know God by the exact observance of the yoke and burden of the Law. There were 613 laws which, if perfectly lived, assured the faithful Israelite of a righteousness in the eyes of God. Jesus does not take away the obligations of law. After all, He did not come to destroy the Law and the Prophets, He came to bring them to perfection. But Jesus offers a new yoke and a new burden.

The words of Jesus must be taken seriously. There must be a yoke and a burden in Christianity. There is a discipline to the Christian life. We must be prepared to take on the command of Jesus to love, and we must strive to live the Gospel we proclaim. That can, at times, appear to be a yoke and a burden, but Jesus assures us that it frees our hearts and responds to our deepest needs. That is why it is easy and light; that is why in taking the risk of opening ourselves and accepting the God and Father of Jesus as our God and Father we will find rest for our souls.



Alert Level I Parish Guidelines

- Holy Communion The faithful are to receive Holy Communion in the hand only, and not from the chalice.
- **Sign of Peace** The exchange of peace can be by spoken word, by a gesture such as bowing, or by a pause for silent prayer for peace. At this stage people should not feel obliged to shake hands.
- Holy Water Fonts are to remain without Holy

These guidelines will be re-evaluated as further health advice is given, or in one month's time. The dispensation from Sunday Mass remains in place for this weekend. People should stay home if they are sick, and contact their doctor if they have flu-like symptoms.
