Sabotage in the Night

Here is the Gospel reading for today. See if you can read it through before Mass begins and take notice of touches you or interests you. Ask our Lord what he is saying to you in that. Then wait and listen. And then respond to him.

Jesus put a parable before the crowds, 'The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field. While everybody was asleep his enemy came, sowed darnel all among the wheat, and made off. When the new wheat sprouted and ripened, the darnel appeared as well. The owner's servants went to him and said, "Sir, was it not good seed that you sowed in your field? If so, where does the darnel come from?" "Some enemy has done this" he answered. And the servants said, "Do you want us to go and weed it out?" But he said, "No, because when you weed out the darnel you might pull up the wheat with it. Let them both grow till the harvest; and at harvest time I shall say to the reapers: First collect the darnel and tie it in bundles to be burnt, then gather the wheat into my

He told them another parable, 'The kingdom of heaven is like the yeast a woman took and mixed in with three measures of flour till it was leavened all through'.

In all this Jesus spoke to the crowds in parables; indeed, he would never speak to them except in parables. This was to fulfil the prophecy: I will speak to you in parables and expound things hidden since the foundation of the world.

Then, leaving the crowds, he went to the house; and his disciples came to him and said, Explain the parable about the darnel in the field to us'. He said in reply, 'The sower of the good seed is the Son of Man. The field is the world; the good seed is the subjects of the kingdom; the darnel, the subjects of the evil one; the enemy who sowed them, the devil; the harvest is the end of the world; the reapers are the angels. Well then, just as the darnel is gathered up and burnt in the fire, so it will be at the end of time. The Son of Man will send his angels and they will gather out of his Kingdom all things that provoke offences an all who do evil, and throw them into the burning furnace, where there will be weeping and grinding of teeth. Then the virtuous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. Listen, anyone who has ears.

The Gospel of the Lord. (Matt 13:24-43)

It is a story of sabotage. By an enemy in the night. And at first the weed is indistinguishable from the wheat. In this parable the good seed are "the subjects of the kingdom". (By contrast, in the parable of the "Sower who went to Sow" of last Sunday, these subjects were the "good soil" who received the seed – an example of the flexibility within the parables.)

Jesus' use of parables demands engagement from the hearer. Those who do not engage, or refuse to, will not understand (as quoted from the prophecy). So it is that Jesus speaks to the disciples apart (they are making that effort: "explain" they say,) and in the house (symbolic of the Church the place of revelation). This goes for all scripture not just the parables. Understanding requires engagement, desire, humility and faith – all of which presumes prayer. Since scripture is the Word of God, written in human language, there is a profundity beyond the mere human meanings of those human words – and we should expect that.


