

A Humble Plucky Generous Canaanite Woman

Here's the 'agenda' or Gospel reading for all Masses throughout the world this Sunday. See if you can read it through before Mass to be better prepared...

Jesus left Gennesaret and withdrew to the region of Tyre and Sidon. Then out came a Canaanite woman from that district and started shouting, 'Sir, Son of David, take pity on me. My daughter is tormented by a devil.' But he answered her not a word. And his disciples went and pleaded with him. 'Give her what she wants,' they said 'because she is shouting after us.' He said in reply, I was sent only to the lost sheep of the House of Israel'. But the woman had come up and was kneeling at his feet. Lord,' she said 'help me.' He replied, 'It is not fair to take the children's food and throw it to the house-dogs'. She retorted, 'Ah yes, sir; but even house-dogs can eat the scraps that fall from their master's table'. Then Jesus answered her, Woman, you have great faith. Let your wish be granted.' And from that moment her daughter was well again.

The Gospel of the Lord. (Matt 15: 21-28. Week 20 year A)

Jesus' attitude to this desperate mother regarding her sick daughter seems quite callous. Which of course gets us thinking. What am I missing here?

The first alarm bell rings out in the very first line. This is Tyre and Sidon (pagan territory) and she is a Canaanite (ancestral enemy tribe of Israel). As a symbol of her people she speaks correctly: 'my daughter is tormented by a devil.' As a people devoted to various gods, it is true, they are spiritually tormented, torn this way and that. They need to know that Jesus is not a wonderworker doing magic as pagans expected. Jesus' cures and miracles come only as a response to faith in him. Faith comes first. Which, it turns out, this woman has.

She recognises Jesus as the Messiah ('Son of David' and 'Lord') showing that she accepts the superiority of the Jewish faith. Seeing this, Jesus still acts coolly to her, for the very purpose of leading her to an even greater confession of faith. And she responds splendidly. The action of kneeling is a Gospel and biblical gesture reserved especially for God, as is her title for him 'Lord'. She believes that Jesus is Lord. Jesus concedes, 'Woman you have great faith.'

There is insufficient space here to discuss the rebuffs in the dialogue. Except to say that she clearly accepts the priority of the Jews in God's plan, and that Jesus' first responsibility is to them. Her humble attitude is perhaps challenging today for us who are Gentiles as she was. Jesus, Mary and the first Christians were all Jews. Jesus' mission was firstly to them. St Paul (a devout and passionate Jew himself) wrestles with this in the Second Reading today since, 'God never takes back his gifts or revokes his choice.' Somehow they are still first.

This Canaanite woman - humble, plucky and generous - stands in for all of us Gentiles. Jesus says (In 4:22) that 'salvation comes from the Jews' and only then to the countless non-Jews of faith like her, her daughter and us.
