

Today's Gospel speaks very much of forgiveness. Is anything different now? Jesus in today's Gospel is reminding us that as a church community we are responsible for each other. One of our tasks of love may be in correcting someone. Not an easy task!

We all know that our communities, church groups, family life, and other organisations are laden with all kinds of conflict. These can be the heaviest of crosses. The hurts and bickering, we are all familiar with these. Forgiveness on the part of the other can become difficult, or even outright rejection. Correction is also a spiritual work of mercy when it comes from real charity. We are confronted with the question 'what is there left to do?"

The first step towards reconciliation is to listen. Sometimes what we hear is not actually what was said. Listening is the first step in reaching out to the other- often painful, but necessary for any hope of reconciliation, forgiveness and peace. If a relationship is important, we need to swallow our pride!

The next step is to involve two or three others. Most people do this first, unfortunately. This can be for our own protection and may mean taking it to higher authorities.

Reconciliation is the key to healing rifts and conflicts. The process is made easier by the knowledge that God is with us if we gather in His name during the process. God sustains us even when we feel no hope. When a community works to settle disputes, Christ is in their midst working to achieve the same result.

The reconciliation process is helped by prayer. When in a conflict we need to seek direction in prayer. We have many opportunities here at St Mary of the Angels. The Lord tells us to pray, and get others to pray with us and for us. "Where two or three are gathered, there am I in their midst". It is all about being accountable to others for the power we hold; using the power of God's kingdom to care for the least and most vulnerable. Let us pray for each other for peace and harmony in our lives.
