

## 13 September 2020, 24th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As We Forgive Those Who Trespass Against Us

Here is the Gospel reading for today's Mass. It will be read and pondered today wherever Mass is celebrated throughout the world.

Peter went up to Jesus and said, Lord, how often must I forgive my brother if he wrongs me? As often as seven times?' Jesus answered, 'Not seven, I tell you, but seventy-seven times.

'And so the kingdom of heaven may be compared to a king who decided to settle his accounts with his servants. When the reckoning began, they brought him a man who owed ten thousand talents; but he had no means of paying, so his master gave orders that he should be sold, together with his wife and children and all his possessions, to meet the debt. At this, the servant threw himself down at his master's feet. "Give me time" he said "and I will pay the whole sum." And the servant's master felt so sorry for him that he let him go and cancelled the debt. Now as this servant went out, he happened to meet a fellow servant who owed him one hundred denarii; and he seized him by the throat and began to throttle him. "Pay what you owe me" he said. His fellow servant fell at his feet and implored him, saying, "Give me time and I will pay you". But the other would not agree; on the contrary, he had him thrown into prison till he should pay the debt. His fellow servants were deeply distressed when they saw what had happened, and they went to their master and reported the whole affair to him. Then the master sent for him. "You wicked servant," he said "I cancelled all that debt of yours when you appealed to me. Were you not bound, then, to have pity on your fellow servant just as I had pity on you?" And in his anger the master handed him over to the torturers till he should pay all his debt. And that is how my heavenly Father will deal with you unless you each forgive your brother from your heart.' Matthew 18:21-35

Here are a few observations.

- This parable illustrates the petition of the Our Father "Forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us."
- A talent is 35 kg of gold. This crook owes 10,000 talents. It is a colossal figure it as been estimated to be more than the combined annual produce of the Eastern Provinces of the then Roman Empire. (Today we might think of the international debts under which developing countries struggle.) How he ran up such a debt is not said. But he is clearly an immensely powerful man. And now on his own, there is no way he could ever earn the sum to pay it back.
- A denarius is the day's wage of a labourer. 100 denarii was a tiny sum by comparison.
- The 'king' is neither God nor Jewish as Jewish law permitted neither the sale of the debtor's wife and children into slavery, nor the use of torture. (King Herod a Jewish puppet of Rome, however ignored these rules, aping foreign rulers of the time.) The 'worship' of the masters implied when the debtors prostrate themselves also demands a pagan setting.
- Forgiveness is a lifelong project. "Seventy-seven times" suggests much practice and repetition for the big and small. And often for the same offence which might creep back into my memory and resentment.
- It is a deeply Catholic approach to read, hold and interpret scripture in its entirety not in isolation. This parable could well be read alongside the Parable of the Weeds in the Wheat in chapter 13, where the good master is patient allowing maximum time for change and conversion.

## Be informed about the End of Life Choice **Act Referendum**

- The End of Life Choice Act is not an option of 'last resort'. It will not just apply to the 'exceptionally difficult cases'. It does not require that a person first make use of available treatments or counselling, nor that they first receive palliative care. A person does not need to be in physical pain.
- If euthanasia becomes legal in NZ, people will access it because they think they lack other choices. Even though quality palliative care is effective, there is no corresponding legal right to access palliative care. Under current law, people can already say 'no' to treatments and can receive whatever level of pain relief they need. These days, no-one need die in pain.

The EOLC Act is badly drafted and seriously flawed. Whatever one's views about the idea of euthanasia, it is not 'compassion' to vote for a dangerous law.
