



THE GREATEST COMMANDMENTS

The angry encounters between Jesus and his opponents come to a conclusion in today's Gospel. In the final attack, the Pharisees attempt to show Jesus' lack of professional knowledge of the Law. He is showing how they are repeating the traditional unfaithfulness of the custodians of the Lord's vineyard, and he has caught them out in their double standards, so now they turn to the Law. In theory, all the commandments were to be observed with equal seriousness. However, within the 613 commandments of the Law, there had developed an understanding of the lighter and heavier commandments. The scholars and scribes argued over these distinctions. The Pharisees now attempt to trap Jesus into making a damaging statement within this learned discussion.

Jesus cuts the ground from under their feet. They could not possibly argue with Jesus' answer. The first part of his response comes from the Book of Deuteronomy (Deut 6:5), and is central to Jewish faith: "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind." The love of God is the first of all commandments. But there is also a second commandment which is like the first: "You must love your neighbour as yourself." This is also part of the Jewish tradition, coming to them from the Book of Leviticus (Lev. 19:18, 34).

Laws hang upon Old Testament passages in the Jewish tradition. Rabbinic discussions look back to the biblical books as the source and explanation of the laws which have developed to meet the developing needs of God's people. Jesus now claims that the whole of the will of God in Scripture hangs upon, is derived from and is summed up in, the double command of love. What God wills is love. All individual commands and obligations must be measured against and judged by the canon of love.

But if it is all summed in the laws that were already found in the Old Testament, what has Jesus introduced into the human story which was not already present? The newness of Jesus' approach has not been to invent the two basic laws. They came to him from his Jewish background. His originality has been to place the love of God and the love of neighbour together. It is impossible to love God and hate your neighbour, and equally impossible to give yourself in love to your neighbour, and claim that you have no love of God. God and the human situation are intimately interwoven, however conscious we are of that truth. This is nowhere more clearly shown than in Jesus of Nazareth, Son of Man and Son of God, but it should also be shown in the love of all who claim to be followers of Christ.

Today's Gospel represents the last argument between Jesus and the teachers of Israel. As we come to the end f a long series of Gospel readings dealing with the clash between Jesus and the false religious practice of the Pharisees, we should remember that the Gospel is read in our liturgy to challenge us, to help us understand better Jesus' way to God. As Jesus argues and teaches through these passages, he is arguing with us and teaching us. There is a Pharisee in each one of us, and we all need to come down from our religious pedestals to learn that there are only two commandments which, in reality, are one; to love God and to love our neighbour.
