## 1 November 2020, All Saints

Here we are in November. We might well ask "Where has the year gone?"

So much has happened during this year and in a couple of weeks we will be into the Church's New Year, the 1st Sunday of Advent.

Today is the Feast of All Saints. Who are these Saints? As well as the well-known saints, they are also our parents, families, friends and the countless number of people who have gone before us. These are the people who shared the faith with us and lived lives according to the Beatitudes. They may not all be canonized saints but they are now living in the presence of God.

May all the saints known and unknown intercede for us, at the throne of the Almighty, so that we can continue their legacy of being living witnesses of the Beatitudes at the Sermon on the Mount, the basic programme to transform us and our world, so that His will may be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Tomorrow we also celebrate All Souls Day, what better way than attending Mass and praying for all deceased members known and unknown. They too will be our saints in heaven in time. We pray for them, and in turn they will remember us. We also encourage you to come to our Bereavement Mass this Thursday 5th November 5.15pm, and pray for all our deceased family members and friends. It is a holy and wholesome thought to pray for the dead.

## **Healing Service**




