Drums, Flaming Torches, Guitars and Chanting Accompany a Veiled Bride

Here is today's Gospel reading. See if you can read it over before Mass. See what strikes you before the priest shares his ideas in the homily. What do you like? Or dislike? Why? Could the Holy Spirit be prodding you about something? Read on:

Jesus told this parable to his disciples:

The kingdom of heaven will be like this: Ten bridesmaids took their lamps and went to meet the bridegroom. Five of them were foolish and five of them were sensible: the foolish ones did take take their lamps, but they brought no oil, whereas the sensible ones took flasks of oil as well as their lamps. The bridegroom was late, and they all grew drowsy and fell asleep. But at midnight there was a cry, "The bridegroom is here! Go out and meet him." At this, all those bridesmaids woke up and trimmed their lamps, and the foolish ones said to the sensible ones, "Give us some of your oil: our lamps are going out". But they replied, "There may not be enough for us and for you; you had better go to those who sell it and buy some for yourselves". They had gone off to buy it when the bridegroom arrived. Those who were ready went in with him to the wedding hall and the door was closed. The other bridesmaids arrived later. "Lord, Lord," they said "open the door for us." But he replied, "I tell you solemnly, I do not know you". So stay awake, because you do not know either the day or the hour. — The Gospel of the Lord (Matt 25:1-13)

Here are a few background ideas.

Oil. This is central to the story. It stands for good works - a life that puts the Gospel into practice - not just thinking or talking about it ("Lord Lord open the door to us!"). Those wise bridesmaids have plenty of this oil in store. They are thoroughly ready for the celebration.

Sleep. This stands for the sleep of death. When Jesus says 'Stay awake', the spiritual meaning of this is 'be prepared'. Sleeping (death) is not the problem since both the wise and the foolish slept. The wise however were ready for the bridegroom when he called upon them to take them to his home.

Bridegroom. Jesus. His comes to take us (the various girls stand for us, the 'bridal' people) to his Father's House at the end of our life. Biblically speaking this refers to the end of time. Hence the long delay.

Wedding. In the Bible, customs varied from one region or epoch (as they still do) making a hard and fast format impossible. Two things were universal however: (1) the bride was taken to live in the extended family, or 'house', of her husband and (2) there was a noisy joyous procession of the bride through the town with her youthful supporters in the early evening to the groom's "Father's House". Boys with drums, girls with flaming torches, and everyone dancing and chanting ensured that the marriage was a public affair. Either the groom (with his noisy young friends) would come to collect her (the scenario of today's parable), or she would be accompanied by her own proud entourage of family, cousins and friends to his home where he would be waiting outside to meet her and take her (with all the supporters) inside - for the feast.

No one and nothing would wait for any girlfriends silly enough to go off and buy oil to fire up their inadequate, dying torches. With the groom and his pumped up cohort singing and drumming on the bride's verandah, for her to come and accompany them to the feast, the moment is NOW. And what a festive, not-to-be-missed moment of fun that will be.


O God, you are my God, for you I long; for you my soul is thirsting.
