SERENITY, COURAGE, WISDOM

Many of us will have been fascinated these last few days by the drama unfolding in the United States of America: an election for president predicted to be a landslide, turning into a cliffhanger then sliding into confusion. From a distance it appears that one powerful man, entrusted with the highest office of his country, is unable to face reality. And, as a consequence, he may only entrench further the discord and divisions which seem to haunt a nation we look to for leadership, both political and economic.

One person in authority can truly do a great deal of damage.

But before we begin to congratulate ourselves for not being like that (shades of the Pharisee reported by Jesus as saying in his prayers: "Thank God I am not like the rest of men"!!) perhaps we could ask ourselves if we have ever done great damage to those around us because we refused to accept reality.

Anyone can be blinded to reality because of such vices as pride and ambition, by a sense of entitlement or status. Anyone who is entrusted with authority or power over others may find themselves speaking or acting in a manner which is destructive rather than productive, whilst perversely claiming that they are only acting in the name of a greater good.

This will become very evident to we Catholics here in New Zealand when, towards the end of this month, the Royal Commission on Abuse begins to examine in public and in detail the terrible offences committed by priests, religious and lay leaders to persons who looked up to them as exemplars of the love and mercy of Jesus. As case histories are reported in the media we will again have to live through a time of unavoidable shame and anger.

But there are many other forms of abuse of authority: in our parishes when priests fail to respect the talents and gifts of parishioners; in homes when parents strike out at their children either physically or verbally; at schools when the weak are bullied by the arrogant and their followers; in work-places when criticism or gossip humiliates colleagues, perhaps destroys their reputation.

Yes, one person in authority - in any walk of life - can truly do a great deal of damage!

I offer a well-known prayer for all of us who are called upon to exercise authority over others, a prayer that encourages us to accept the reality of our lives and to look upon others as Christ would have us:

"Lord, grant me the serenity to accept the things I cannot change; The courage to change the things I can; And the wisdom to know the difference"

World Day of the Poor 2020 "Stretch forth your hand to the poor"

Today, Sunday 15 November is the World Day of the Poor. Pope Francis has called on people to keep their gaze fixed on the poor, especially during the Covid-19 pandemic. This year's theme is "Stretch forth your hand to the poor", taken from the book of Sirach. Pope Francis points out that "prayer to God and solidarity with the poor and suffering are inseparable."

Even during this pandemic, the Word of God "constantly impels us to acts of love," Pope Francis says. He also describes how the command: 'Stretch forth your hand to the poor' "challenges the attitude of those who prefer to keep their hands in their pockets and to remain unmoved by situations of poverty in which they are often complicit." Concluding his message, the Pope recalls that in the book of Sirach it is written, 'In everything you do, remember your end.' He continues by saying, "the 'end' of all our actions can only be love. This is the ultimate goal of our journey, and nothing should distract us from it."

Heavenly Father we thank you for the reminder from Sirach that "In all your actions, remember your end" (Sir7.36). Help us to always remember our common destiny with our brothers and sisters and to lead a life of attention to those who are poorer and have not had the same opportunities as us.

Lord help us to remember that you are authentic love and are the true meaning of love. Help us to abide in love. Make our every action have as its purpose - love for you and love for others - especially the poor. Remind us each day that we are loved and help us to be awakened to love. Help us to share what we have with the poor and to remember that even a smile can be a source of love and allows us to live in joy. Amen.
