22 November 2020, Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe

CHRIST THE KING

There are many ways in which Jesus is our Universal King. One of the most important of them is his role as judge. Some details in Matthew's story of the final judgment could distract us from its central point: the majesty of the Son of Man coming with all the angels as judge, the fact of a final reckoning, the separation of the sheep and the goats. These important features of the story serve to present the real question: what is the criterion of judgment?

However important the in-between time may be, it cannot take away from the central truth that the Son of Man, the one who suffered but was raised, will come again in glory as judge. Only Matthew describes the final judgment in such concrete and practical terms. Using the imagery of sheep and goats, he presents the final division of the blessed from cursed as the result of our behaviour during the "in-between time."

Jesus is our Universal King. The Gospel of Matthew shows that he exercises his kingship by choosing us, but by then setting us free so that we might return to him as his responsible daughters and sons at the end of time. Christ is a king who has given us the offer of life but we are responsible for it. He takes each one of us seriously by sharing his love with those around us who are less fortunate. How will the present generation be judged? How do I treat those who are members of the family of Jesus who look to me for affection, care and support? Will I be judged as a sheep or a goat? Although the characters in the Gospel story did not know that Jesus was present in the least of the members of his family, I do know. I have read the story!
