29 November 2020, 1st Sunday of Advent

Today we start the season of Advent, four weeks of preparation for Christmas. Many times this season is described as the season of waiting. What are we waiting for? The Lord's coming.

An important part of fulfillment as human beings is having a personal relationship with God. We do not discover God; it is God who comes and enters our lives. In the past God spoke to our ancestors through the prophets. Today God speaks to us through His Son Jesus. All we can do is to prepare ourselves and wait for His coming.

Through a relationship with God we encounter Jesus in the Scriptures - the Word of God. He is present in the Sacraments which are channels of our encounter with the Risen Lord. The voice of our conscience is another way we encounter God in our every day life. When we pay attention to His voice the clearer and louder it becomes. If we take it for granted and pay no attention, there will be a time when we do not hear the voice of God and things can go wrong.

Through these circumstances of our lives we bring God into the ordinary affairs of our daily lives. Our neighbour is an encounter with God, as Scripture says "Whatever you did to the least of my brothers and sisters, you did it to me'. Jesus could not have been clearer. What he wanted to say cannot be misinterpreted. The people we meet each day are occasions to encounter God.

In the Gospel of Mark we hear the word "Watch." Jesus is commanding that we watch and pray. This command is in the present tense which signifies that our watching is not a short term engagement but a constant and never ending commitment, something for all of us to do.

As we enter this season of Advent let us watch, pray and use Reconciliation as our preparation. Let us be prepared for the coming of the Lord.

NEW SMOA Church App

- 3. The app will then prompt you to select which "alert groups" you want to be a part of. Select as many or as few of these groups as you like. You will be able to change this later if you need to.
