'Giving the Show Away' in the First Sentence

Here is the Gospel for today's Sunday Mass. It is the 'agenda' for today and for the week ahead. After you've greeted our Lord and prayed that you may be one with him in this Mass, read over this Gospel. It's a good way to be focussed or 'ready' for the Mass.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.

The beginning of the Good News about Jesus Christ, the Son of God. It is written in the book of the prophet Isaich:

Look, I am going to send my messenger before you;

he will prepare your way.

A voice cries in the wilderness:

Prepare a way for the Lord,

make his paths straight.

And so it was that John the Baptist appeared in the wilderness, proclaiming a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. All Judaea and all the people of Jerusalem made their way to him, and as they were baptised by him in the river Jordan they confessed their sins. John wore a garment of camel-skin, and he lived on locusts and wild honey. In the course of his preaching he said, 'Someone is following me, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to kneel down and undo the strap of his sandals. I have baptised you with water, but he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit.'

The Gospel of the Lord. (Mark 1:1-8)

Some Background Ideas to the Opening Sentence.

You will notice from the reference (Mark 1:1-8) that this is the very opening of St Mark's Gospel: Chapter 1 verse 1. And we know that Mark is the first or oldest of the four gospels. So it is the opening sentence for all four of them. Mark seems to have invented this genre - a "Gospel". It is a book that is neither a Letter nor a Biography nor a History. He borrows the word "Gospel" or "good news" from the emperors who used it for announcements of victories, coronations or births of crown princes. The 'good news' of these pagan rulers or Caesars was always a promise of a new era of peace, justice and prosperity – which of course they never delivered. Politicians have long promised such things. But this time with the Messiah it will come true spiritually speaking. And Mark knows that.

Mark calls it 'the beginning'. Yes this is the start of his book. Or perhaps the whole Gospel book is a beginning of something completely new. Mark expects us to know our bible and to recall the start of Genesis "in the beginning" when our story with God began.

Calling Jesus "Jesus Christ" lets us know that Jesus is the Messiah. Christ is the Greek word for Messiah meaning "the anointed" of God. Finally, naming Jesus as "the Son of God" really gives the 'show away' at the very start of this book.

So from the very first sentence we find out who this book is really about. It is not meant to be suspense story, a surprise. We readers are told who Jesus is from the first line. We should never forget that, as we read on – even though many of the characters whom we will meet along the way will wonder who this Jesus is.

Ok, well at least we've covered the first sentence. And that's all that there's room for. What are your thoughts re the rest of reading?
